At Bishop Ellis Catholic Voluntary Academy, we acknowledge and welcome diversity among pupils, staff, governors and visitors.

Our Equality Policy outlines the commitment of the staff and governors to promote equality. This involves tackling the barriers which could lead to unequal outcomes so that there is equality of access and the diversity within the school community is celebrated and valued. #### **Equality Objectives**

At Bishop Ellis Catholic Voluntary Academy, we are committed to ensuring equality of education and opportunity for all pupils, staff, parents, and carers, irrespective of race, gender, disability, belief, religion or socio-economic background.

In order to further support pupils, raise standards and ensure inclusive teaching, we have set the following objectives:-

Objective 1: To improve rates of attendance for PP children in order to reduce the gap with none PP children, and persistent absence will reduce to be at least in line with the national average.

Impact statement: Attendance data will demonstrate that PP children are attending as well as their peers. Where this is not the case, there are clearly identified steps in place to support the family to maintain regular attendance.

Objective 2: To raise levels of attainment across the curriculum for vulnerable learners.

Objective 3: To monitor and analyse pupil achievement by race, gender and disability and act on any trends or patterns in the data that require additional support for pupils.

Impact statement for objectives 2 and 3: All children who attend Bishop Ellis will make sustained progress over time throughout the whole curriculum. Where this is not the case, there are clearly identified intervention programmes in place.

Objective 4: To increase understanding about different religious groups and wider cultural knowledge

Impact statement: The curriculum design will include opportunities for pupils to learn about different religious groups and to increase their understanding of them.
