In Church this Sunday we celebrate a special feast – the Baptism of the Lord. The new year presents an opportunity to remember, or to discover, the blessings received at Baptism. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus begins his mission to the world when the Holy Spirit comes down upon him – the same Spirit we receive through Baptism and Confirmation.

Pope Francis reminds us that, "Faith is a gift which we receive in Baptism and which allows us to encounter God." Jesus came for everyone: to draw us all into his family so that we can become more like him and joyfully share in God's own life.

Jubilee Year 2025

Pope Francis has given the 2025 Jubilee Year the theme of Pilgrims of Hope. This information is from the CAFOD website.

What is a Jubilee Year?

In the Catholic Church, a Jubilee or Holy Year is a special year of forgiveness and reconciliation, in which people are invited to come back into right relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation.

How often is a Jubilee Year?

A Jubilee Year is celebrated by the Church every 25 years. This has been the case since 1470, when Pope Paul II changed it from every 50 years. A Pope can also proclaim an Extraordinary Jubilee, like the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy which Pope Francis inaugurated in 2015.

What is the theme of the Jubilee Year in 2025?

The theme is Pilgrims of Hope. Pope Francis has invited us to renew our hope and discover a vision that can "restore access to the fruits of the earth to everyone". We are also invited to rediscover a spirituality of God's creation in which we understand ourselves as "pilgrims on the earth" rather than masters of the world.

We will be celebrating the Jubilee year in many different ways in school and across the CMAT. One of our main actions is to create our Jubilee chapel in school.

Our attendance so far this year is **95.6%**. This currently places us in the top 25% of schools nationally. Our aim is for attendance to be **96%**.

To show the children the importance of science in society, we would like to invite visitors in to school to speak to the children on Friday 14th March 2025. These visitors can be parents, family members or family friends. We are looking for any jobs that have a link to science- vet, doctor, surgeon, nurse, personal trainer, paramedic, electrician, science lecturer, teacher, baker, plumber, builder etc. We would like to invite visitors into the hall where we will set up a jobs fair with tables and chairs where the children can move around and ask questions. If you can come to school for the morning (9.30-11.15) or afternoon (1.30-2.45) on Friday 14th March, we would love to hear from you. You don't need to prepare anything but if you have any items or photographs to help the children. If you can give up some of your time, then please contact the school office to let them know who you are, what your job role is, contact details and which session you are able to attend. We hope that this will be a fantastic opportunity for the children to see how science can be such a huge part of our lives and hopefully inspire them to learn about jobs that they may have never considered.
